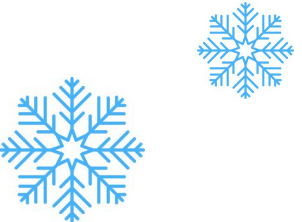
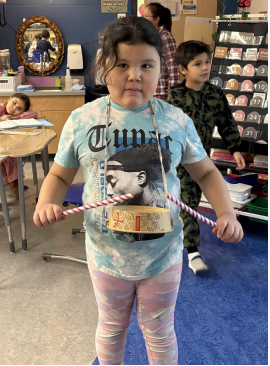

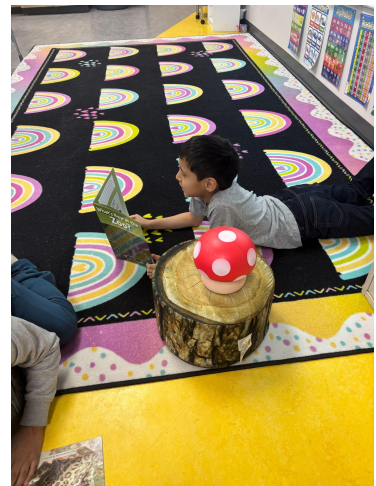
GR.3-

A new section of Art will be beginning with Mrs. Murray in January with a new group of students. Topics covered will depend on student interest and skill level.

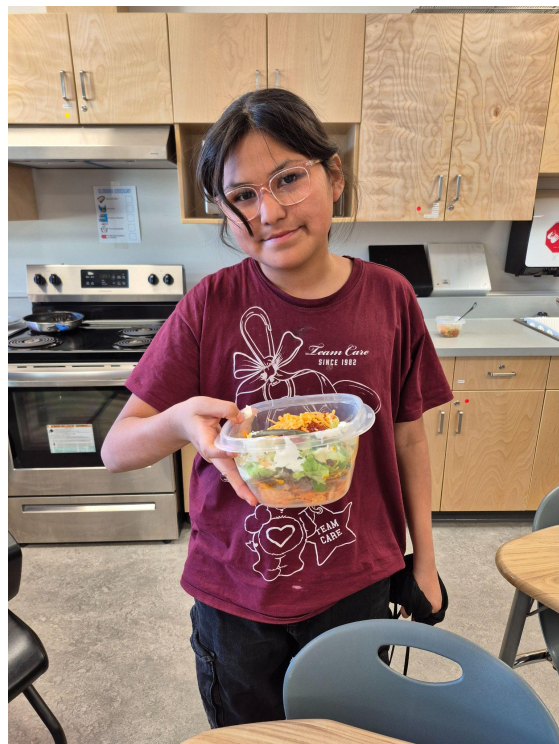
OUTDOOR ED
